This scholarship was created in memory of Joe Krumm, former NCS D Executive Director of Community and Government Relations, in order to honor and continue his legacy of advocacy for all students. Its aim is to reduce financial barriers for students identified with specific learning and/or communication needs that have warranted the educational supports of either an IEP or 504, or which have resulted in an identification on the autism spectrum. Joe was a life-long musician and a strong advocate for equity in post-secondary opportunities for students. His whole-hearted advocacy on behalf of students with special needs, commitment to an inclusive vision of community involvement in our schools, and leadership in the journey toward racial equity will continue to inspire all of us who work with the students of North Clackamas.

Please submit the following as three separate documents;

1. NCEF Bridges to Success Scholarship Application located at [nc-foundation.org/applications](http://nc-foundation.org/applications) – all scholarship applicants must submit this application, all applicants will be entered into the opportunity to receive a Bridges to Success Scholarship, if applicants are applying for more than one scholarship, they need only submit this application once.
2. A Counselor Recommendation Form located at [nc-foundation.org/applications](http://nc-foundation.org/applications)– all scholarship applicants must submit this form, only one form needed per applicant if submitting multiple scholarship applications, **applications will not be considered without this form.**
3. A document answering the following questions;
  1. Are or have either of your parents been NCS D employees? If so, please provide name, positions, and years of employment.
  2. Are you a member of an under-represented group with respect to post-secondary education? If so, please explain (less than 25 words).
  3. The following essay questions;
    1. Describe the impact of your personal learning style and needs on your educational experience, include how you have advocated for yourself and adapted in order to overcome obstacles. (500 words)
    2. Describe the role of music in your life, focus on your involvement and participation in North Clackamas Schools and/or community music programs, include specific information (school/program names and dates) about those in which you have participated during your experience. (500 words)

All applications must be submitted by midnight Friday April 30<sup>th</sup>, 2021.
