

**Future Educator's Scholarship
Student Information**

Description

This scholarship supports North Clackamas School District seniors who are dreaming of a career in which they can inspire our next generation. This \$1,000 scholarship is for students who will complete a Bachelor's Degree in pre-K-12 teaching at an accredited Oregon two or four-year college.

Purpose

This scholarship was founded to inspire students to pursue a career in education. High-quality teachers are in a unique career that allows them to change students' lives and positively shape our community. By providing this scholarship they seek to ensure that we welcome a new generation of teachers into our community schools.

Amount of the Award (s)

The Future Educator's Scholarship is a \$1,000 on time scholarship to be awarded to one student each year.

Type of Award

The scholarship is non-renewable and will be delivered directly to the student's chosen school/program once the student has provided proof of enrollment and requested the funds be applied to their student account.

Selection Criteria

The selection criteria for the scholarship are:

1. Applicants must have a cumulative high school GPA of at least 3.0
2. Applicants must be graduating from Adrienne C Nelson High School, Clackamas High School, New Urban High School, Milwaukie High School, or Rex Putnam High School

Application Process (for high school seniors)

Applicants must submit:

- 1) An evaluation form from two core subject teachers from the student's Junior and/or Senior year (link found inside the online application) Their unofficial transcript

- 2) A document answering the following questions*:
- a. What high school do you attend?
 - b. Which Oregon college or university have you committed to?
 - c. As you plan your career, what ages and/or subjects do you think you may want to teach?
 - d. A 200-300 word essay answering the following prompt;
Describe an activity outside of the classroom that you participated in. It does not have to be a part of a formal organization. Consider sports, clubs, community or church activities, hobbies, or learning experiences such as workshops, camps, or extra classes. Explain how you experienced personal growth by participating in this activity.
 - e. A 300-500 word essay answering the following prompt;
Describe a teacher or mentor who had an effect on you, positive or negative. Describe how their example will affect what kind of teacher you want to be.
 - f. A short description of any significant extenuating circumstances you would like the scholarship committee to know about (this is not required and no penalization will be made if it is not included in the application submission)

*Applications are found on the NCEF website and preference is that they be submitted through the available Google forms. Applications will be accepted in a document format when necessary.
